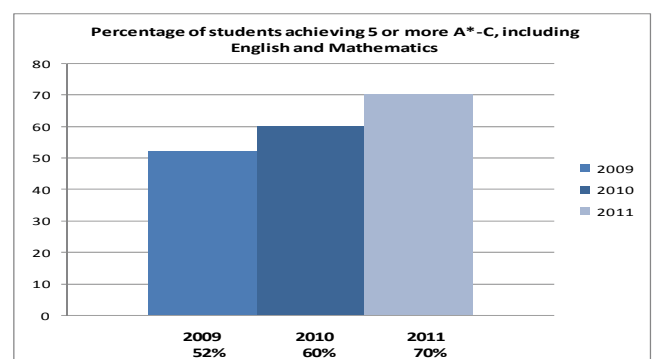

The school is committed to continuous improvement and will convert to Academy status from March 2012. It is an organisation that values its staff and their work with students. Staff are supported with training opportunities designed to improve the quality of teaching and learning in the classroom. This includes a bursary programme through which all staff can apply to undertake a 12-month research project of their choosing for which they receive direct funding. THE HUMANITIES FACULTY

The Humanities Faculty comprises of a dedicated team of enthusiastic teachers. We have a record of academic success and are committed to high standards. The Humanities Faculty comprises of specialist staff in History, Geography and Religious Studies. The Humanities suite consists of 6 rooms, all recently refurbished, with IWB and sound systems. The faculty also has a central office where staff can work.

In 2011 the faculty achieved 85% A*-C in GCSE Geography (OCR A) and 84% A*-C in GCSE History (AQA B). In KS4 option classes are largely mixed ability and are taught 5 lessons a fortnight. In KS3 groups are banded by ability into three bands. Schemes of work are of a high standard and include activities and resources to encourage all learning styles.

Faculty Rationale

To be an innovative and supportive faculty that enhances and enriches education and promotes a love of learning

Faculty Aim

- Work as a team to develop courses in Humanities which offer our students a wide learning experience, including off site visits, the use of a variety of source material and a wide range of teaching and learning strategies. To have at least 70% of lessons rated as 'good'

Teaching Aims

The main aims of the Humanities Department are as follows:

1. To help students to understand the world we live in today.
2. To arouse an interest in learning.
3. To give students a sense of identity – to teach students about their own country, institutions, beliefs, values and customs.
4. To develop their knowledge and understanding of other countries and other cultures.
5. To train students to undertake disciplined enquiry, to test evidence, to be capable of analysis, evaluation and logical argument.
6. To enrich the entire curriculum – to enable students to draw on their knowledge to enhance their performance in other areas

Objectives

1. Students should show an increasing factual knowledge of Geography, History and RE based in the content specified in the National Curriculum Document. They should be able to deploy a broad range of relevant terminology accurately.
2. Students should be given ample opportunity to present their answers in extended writing. They should be able to construct narratives, descriptions and explanations by the end of KS3.
3. Students should use a range of sources including: Documents and printed sources, artefacts, pictures and photographs, music, buildings and sites, computer based materials.
4. Students should be taught Humanities subjects from a variety of perspectives: Political, economic, technical, scientific, social, cultural, religious, aesthetic, international, national and local.
