MSF has faced difficulties with SMBC regarding intake – some students proposed were not appropriate. MSF talked through referral arrangements process and the criteria students must meet to attend LG. LG will be open full time from first week back after half term – all students will be KS4 students. MSF confirmed 3 members of teaching staff and the remaining are support staff. The main LG building phase 1 has started until February on current tennis courts in East. SB Laurus Grace asked for confirmation if LG will fall under HGHS Academy Committee. MS and MSF confirmed until we have a full cohort and building in place LG will fall under HGHS AC.
