



#### What is LGBT+ Pride?

LGBT+ Pride Month is marked annually in June, to celebrate the LGBT+ community.

Pride Month began to commemorate the Stonewall riots, a series of protests for LGBT+ liberation, beginning on 28th June, 1969. Many schools across the globe use Pride Month as an opportunity to educate young people on the history of the LGBT+ community and to celebrate all those within their school who identify as LGBT+.

Earlier this year, LGBT+ History Month was celebrated. This is an event founded in the UK by Paul Patrick and Professor Emeritus Sue Sanders. Paul and Sue are the founders of <u>Schools OUT</u>, an LGBT+ education charity and they spearheaded the first UK LGBT+ History Month in February 2005. From then on, the movement has grown, with more and more schools taking part every year.

Young motorcyclists will be given the chance to gain advice and guidance from experts, and have their questions answered, at an online event taking place next month.

The Warwickshire Road Safety Partnership is partnering with the National Young Rider Forum (NYRF) to host a free session for young motorcycle riders taking place on 11 June 2025.

The hour-long event, which kicks-off at 6:30pm, is aimed at those aged between 16-24 years who may be thinking of, or already riding, powered two wheelers of up to 125cc.
